

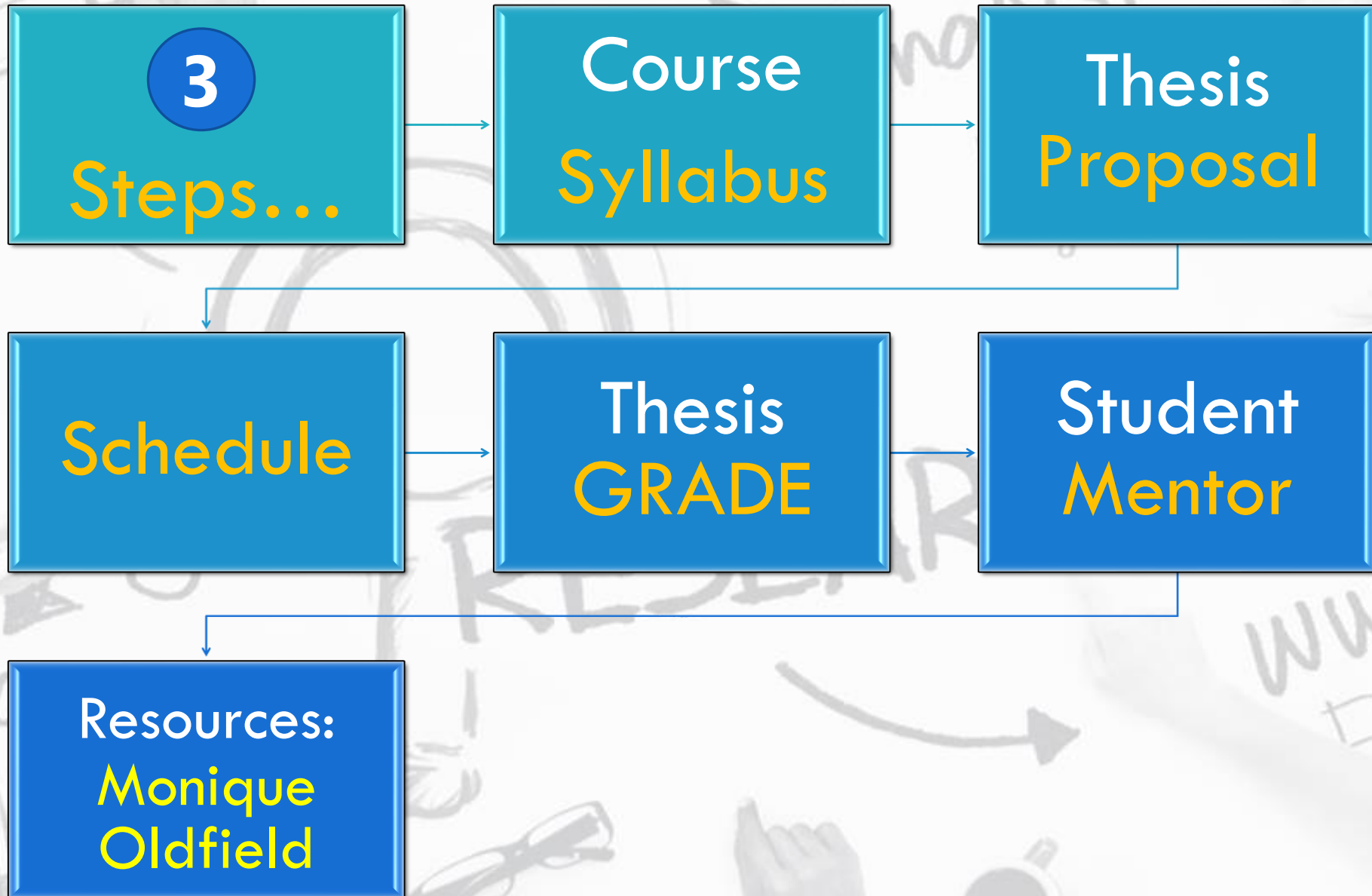

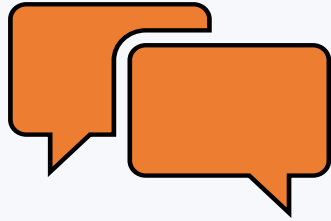

Course description from the current *Undergraduate Bulletin*

Prerequisite: junior or senior standing and Honors College approval.

For students not concurrently in a Departmental Honors program (**n.b.** with the exception of Foreign Language Honors). Honors students should plan to register for the course at least two semesters prior to graduation. Eligible projects could include: independent research project, essay, or creative project. *Students are responsible for identifying their own research project and full-time faculty member.* If needed, at the end of the first semester, students can request a deferred ("Y") grade with a grade change processed at the completion of the thesis in a subsequent semester.

About the Honors College

The University Honors track is an interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary program that includes

- A foundational sequence with a fall City course and a winter seminar (of student's course)
- A field or experiential learning course involves one of the parameters:
 - service-learning
 - UG Research
 - Study/Travel abroad
 - Internship/Co-op/Practicum

The Departmental Honors track, often referred to as "Honors in your major," is discipline-specific and requirements including thesis course will vary based on the program.

Course Outcomes

At the conclusion of the Honors Thesis experience, students are expected to be able to:

- Communicate effectively in written and oral form (Information Literacy, Writing)
 - Use standard, edited American English (or, for Language Honors majors, whichever language is agreed upon by the students and instructor)
 - Consider audience and purpose
 - Select the appropriate tone and genre
 - Adapt to different writing situations
 - Build a clear, cohesive argument
 - Effectively revise and proof materials
- Demonstrate critical thinking skills (Problem Solving, Critical Thinking)
 - Collect and organize credible evidence
 - Formulate questions
 - Evaluate arguments
 - Construct arguments
 - Employ knowledge to solve problems
